All are united in the cause to bring full accountability for Prisoners Of War (POW) and Missing In Action (MIA) of all wars, reminding the government, the media and the public by our watchwords: "We Will Not Forget."

Flag Etiquette

The Flag Code, which formalizes and unifies the traditional ways in which we give respect to the flag, also contains specific instructions on how the flag is not to be used. They are:

- The flag should never be dipped to any person or thing. It is flown upside down only as a distress signal.
- The flag should not be used as a drapery, or for covering a speakers desk, draping a platform, or for any decoration in general. Bunting of blue, white and red stripes is available for these purposes. The blue stripe of the bunting should be on the top.
- The flag should never be used for any advertising purpose. It should not be embroidered, printed or otherwise impressed on such articles as cushions, handkerchiefs, napkins, boxes, or anything intended to be discarded after temporary use. Advertising signs should not be attached to the staff or halyard
- The flag should not be used as part of a costume or athletic uniform, except that a flag patch may be used on the uniform of military personnel, fireman, policeman and members of patriotic organizations.
- The flag should never have placed on it, or attached to it, any mark, insignia, letter, word, number, figure, or drawing of any kind.
- The flag should never be used as a receptacle for receiving, holding, carrying, or delivering anything.

When the flag is lowered, no part of it should touch the ground or any other object; it should be received by waiting hands and arms. To store the flag it should be folded neatly and ceremoniously.

The flag should be cleaned and mended when necessary.

When a flag is so worn it is no longer fit to serve as a symbol of our country, it should be destroyed by burning in a dignified manner.

Wreaths Across America History

Morrill Worcester, owner of Worcester Wreath Company of Harrington, Maine, was a 12-year old paper boy when he won a trip to Washington D.C. It was his first to our nation's capital and one that would change the trajectory of his life and the lives of millions of others across the country. Seeing the hundreds of thousands of graves and the Tomb of the Unknown Soldier at Arlington National Cemetery made an especially indelible impression on him. It was to be an experience that would follow him throughout his life and successful career, reminding him that his good fortune was due, in large part, to the values of his nation and the veterans who made the ultimate sacrifice for their country.

In 1992, Worcester Wreath found themselves with a surplus of wreaths nearing the end of the holiday season. Remembering his boyhood experience at Arlington, Worcester realized he had an opportunity to honor our country's veterans. With the aid of Maine Senator Olympia Snowe (ret), arrangements were made for the surplus wreaths to be placed at Arlington in one of the older cemetery sections that had been receiving fewer visitors each passing year. And so it begins...

Event Spotlight—Wreaths Across America

Wreaths Across America is a coordinated National event where wreaths are placed on veteran's graves at events taking place at the same time across the U.S.

This year's event was on Saturday, December 16, 2023. In our community, Conejo Mountain Memorial Park has sponsored this event for many years, where there are over 3,000 veteran graves.

This is the first year that
Rolling Thunder CA-1 has been
responsible for coordinating
this event at Conejo
Mountain. During the event,
over 800 wreaths were placed,
which is almost double from
last year, but the goal is to
ensure that all 3,000 +
veterans receive a wreath, so
that is our goal for this year.

S.42 - BUILD for Veterans Act of 2023	Senate - 01/24/2023 Read twice and referred to the Committee on Veterans' Affairs.
H.R.214 - Veterans' True Choice Act of 2023	House - 01/09/2023 Referred to the Committee on Armed Services, and in addition to the .Committee on Veterans' Affairs, for a period to be subsequently determined by the Speaker, in each case for consideration of such provisions as fall within the jurisdiction of the committee concerned.
H.R.232 - Real Justice for Our Veterans Act of 2023	House - 01/10/2023 Referred to the House Committee on the Judiciary.
H.R.733 - Vet CENTERS for Mental Health Act of 2023	House - 02/01/2023 Referred to the House Committee on Veterans' Affairs.
